A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

A prophet is despised only in his own country.

Jesus went to his home town and his disciples accompanied him. With the coming of the sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard him. They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Homily - Fr John Purnell

This Gospel reading begins as Jesus and His disciples return home, to his native place. On the Sabbath, Jesus went to the synagogue and He began to teach. All who listened to Jesus were astonished. They were taken aback at the power of His teaching as well as the power of His presence. This was Jesus, a man they knew very well. He was a man who had grown up in their midst.

How had Jesus become so knowledgeable and such a powerful speaker? He was the son of a carpenter, not the son of a Rabbi. Many people in his hometown discounted Jesus and His message. They refused to listen to Him. After all, who did Jesus think He was to preach to the people who had known Him from birth?

Jesus did not get angry. Rather, Jesus replied to their comments by saying that typically a prophet is not honored by the people who have known him from birth. Jesus realised that He simply was too familiar to them. They only saw in Him what they wanted to see. Thus Jesus was unable to perform any great deeds there as they did not have faith in Him.

It can be easy to discount the people whom we know the best. They are so very familiar to us that we simply may take them for granted. Take a moment and think about the people in your life: what are their gifts? How do they gift you with their love and care? Do you appreciate them? Do you appreciate their gifts and talents? Do you let them know how important they are to you?

Today make time to give thanks for the many people who love and care about you! In some small way, let them know how grateful you are to have them in your life!

Dear All,

As you know, the Premier of NSW last weekend announced the immediate introduction of some quite strict COVID-19 safety practices. The main ones affecting our liturgies & places of worship include: all attendees (including clergy) wearing masks (unless they are under age 12 or have a physical/mental condition that exempts them), no singing, maintaining 1.5 mt distance between persons not from the same household, churches returning to capacities based on the 1 person/4 sq metre rule, and where possible everyone registering their attendance via the QR code. Also, masks can only be removed briefly to consume Communion or by readers/commentators to proclaim the Word or make announcements. I commend those attending Masses across our region last weekend for complying really well with these at very short notice. Thank you. I understand these rules are onerous but they will need

prosecute breaches. I am sorry for any anxiety these measures may be causing anyone in our communities, but hopefully our compliance, along with that of others outside our Catholic communities, will enable the authorities to relax some of these provisions in the near future.
