This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Homilette Mk 6 30 34 Prayer Deserted Lonely Place – Fr Graham Fullick

Jesus says "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest for a while". The place is deserted of people, but not lonely. Alone with God we are never alone. As humans we are social. We rebuild in a blessed space in time, "prayer", in order to build up communion. We like the Apostles have been blessed by God, who gives us rest as well as inspiration. Jesus seeks to make us truly refreshed. Jesus knows that our souls are hungry for more than earthly food. Prayer is our eternal food. Prayer is breath for the soul. Our soul needs prayer as our lungs need air to breathe. We need both prayer and to feed on prayer. The hand of the Lord feeds us, He answers all our needs.

At the end of the day, review the day: the good, the bad, the ugly, the beautiful. The Jesuit examen prayer. How have I been Christian or not today in action, reaction and inaction? How have I looked at my fellow humans? With Jesus' love and compassion? Beyond thanksgiving and gratitude, for what can we praise God? Like a husband and wife sharing at the end of the day, what is our communion of prayer and life with the Lord? Resolutions or thoughts of a night time are often much clearer and purer after being slept on.

During the day, what do we have to be thankful for, sitting for five minutes in the work truck? What's on the radio or the smart phone? Christian input and sites, a prayer or Carmelite reflection app? "The Catholic Gentleman" site? How do we offer the work of our hands as the work of heart and soul in a job that serves others' needs. Having lunch, we can read Christian things or pray and zone in to God. As students, do we join the Catholic Society or visit the uni. chaplaincy or a young peoples' Bible study group or Adoration such as "Sacred at Seven"? There is Adoration daily in our St. Joseph's East Maitland. St. John's chapel Maitland is open sunrise to sunset and there is Prayer of the Church at Our Lady of Lourdes, Beresfield among other formal opportunities. Sheep in a rich country have plenty of distracting pasture. What we need is to look for a good shepherd to take us to the right pasture. Jesus wants to take us out in his boat to a deserted place teeming with eternal life. Prayer time takes us to that eternal place populated by the Holy Spirit where we will never be hungry.
