A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

He distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted.

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee - or of Tiberias - and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover. Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world." Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Homily—Fr Maurie Cahill Sunday dedicated to grandparents and to the elderly.

And at baptisms, we can see there is so much love and care of grandparents – their faith quietly obvious and their very presence bestowing their own blessing on the gathering. Pope Francis has declared this Sunday dedicated to grandparents and the elderly. Francis says that the aged must not see themselves as no longer important. The elderly find their energy has diminished, and life limited in so many ways; perhaps they can no longer leave their dwelling. And there also likely are the sufferings and inabilities that age brings. Add the loneliness and sorrows that is so often part of growing old. Francis says they must not see themselves as useless and "on the scrap heap"; that they are a precious link, a valuable, even powerful part of the Church. Francis says even the memories they have and their wisdom are a blessing they can share with younger generations. My elderly mother used to say that she found she could pray so much better now than when she was younger and busy with all the family. (But I wonder which was the better prayer – in the difficult or in the easier times?) Pope Francis insists that the prayer of the elderly is a power of grace which flows over the whole church – the Church which is so much in need. They are their own special part of the powerhouse that drives the work of the Lord. He encourages all to read a page of the gospel every day to absorb the love of the Lord. Francis concedes that he is indeed a member of the aged, carrying many of its disabilities. But it certainly has not dimmed his tremendous love of the Lord or his zest for teaching the world to live by it. Today he has a special word of the Lord for the elderly: to know that the promise of the Lord is true for them when he says, "Behold, I am with you always."

I have seen grandparents who have flown from Ireland to be present at a grandchild's first Holy Communion.

Update on COVID Check-in Requirements to **Enter our Parish Buildings**

1. Anyone who has a phone that can scan QR codes, has an obligation to scan in upon entering any of our parish buildings (for Mass, prayer, cleaning or any other purpose).

Also, please remember to check-out upon leaving. 2.If you are unable to scan the QR code, please seek assistance from someone who can, so they can scan you in on their device. Instead of putting all this burden upon the one person who normally monitors everyone entering, it would be good for regular attendees to 'buddy-up' with someone they know who would be happy to scan them in each time they attend.

3. Please only record your attendance in written form (ie on paper) if you can't register yourself or get someone else to register you via the QR code. On top of this, please remain vigilant in wearing masks, safe distancing, not exceeding allowable church capacity numbers and in observing no congregational singing.
