My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that?

Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Gospel Mk 7:31-37

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

He makes the deaf hear and the dumb

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Homily - Fr John Lovell

'Ephphatha', Jesus says in our Gospel to a deaf man wanting to be healed. It's an Aramaic word meaning 'be opened'. Its also part of our Baptismal rite where the priest or deacon points to the child's ears and mouth and says, "The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive His Word, and your mouth to proclaim His faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father".

While Jesus was always happy to heal the physical disabilities of people who were paralysed, lame, blind, deaf, dumb or suffering from some other condition, His greatest concern was for people's spiritual healing. For in an earlier chapter of this Gospel He speaks of those who 'see and see again, but not perceive...hear and hear again but not understand' (Mark 4:12).

It was the founder of Western monasticism, St Benedict, who taught his followers to, "Listen with the ear of the heart". We might ask, how do we do this and why?

If we don't learn to listen to God speaking to us in our hearts, how can we come to develop a meaningful relationship with Him, which we each need if we are to discover His particular purpose for us in our lives? This requires regular periods of silence in which we open our hearts and say, like the Prophet Samuel, 'Speak Lord, your servant is listening'. If we persevere with this, especially in conjunction with reflection on the Word of God, the ears of our hearts will be opened, 'Ephphatha', and we'll come to know and fulfil that special mission the Lord is calling each of us to in our lives.

<u>Fathers</u>⁷ <u>Day</u>: This Sunday being Fathers Day, we give special thanks at this time for all our fathers: our natural fathers, adopted fathers and spiritual fathers. We pray that the Holy Spirit will guide all these men to live as true models of our one universal Father in Heaven.
