And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

#### Homily - Fr John Purnell

On this 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time, we hear the story of Bartimaeus, the blind man. As Jesus was leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus was sitting on the roadside begging for alms. When Bartimaeus realised that Jesus was passing by, he cried out to him: *"Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!"* 

The people around Bartimaeus tried to silence him. However, Bartimaeus was determined to get Jesus' attention. He continued to cry out: *"Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!"* 

When Jesus heard Bartimaeus' plea, he stopped and said to his disciples: "*Call him*." The disciples called to Bartimaeus: "*Take courage and get up! Jesus is calling you!*" Immediately, Bartimaeus jumped up, threw his cloak aside and went to Jesus. Jesus quietly asked him: "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus replied: "Master, I want to see." Jesus then said to him: "Go on your way; your faith has saved you." And in that instant, Bartimaeus received his sight and he followed Jesus on the way.

Ask yourself: What is the "sight" that you wish to ask Jesus for today? What is it that you need to see? Then be attentive throughout the day. Jesus may give you your "sight" in an unexpected or unusual way. Be attentive to each person you encounter. Truly look at each person. They may appreciate a few minutes of your time and attention. Or perhaps they simply need some recognition that you have "seen" them.

Today give thanks for the people who notice and "see" you. They have given you a great gift. In return, share this small but loving gift with others!

Dear Friends,

Due to our NSW vaccination target reaching 80% earlier than expected, our Vicar-General has announced we can re-open our churches as soon as practicable for Mass, prayer and other liturgies. I have accordingly asked our Office Staff and Parish Teams to prepare for Masses to recommence from this weekend 23/24 October. By that time a mandatory current COVID safety plan will be available for each of our Mass centres.

It will not be mandatory for anyone to be fully vaccinated to enter our church buildings and we will not be checking anyone's vaccination status. However, the Church encourages everyone who can to get vaccinated for their own protection. Anyone with cold or flu like symptoms is urged to get tested and isolate until a negative result is received, and anyone who is in any other way unwell or feeling very vulnerable is urged not to attend church at this time. Until further notice, we must comply with the following covid-safe precautions in our church buildings: 4 sqm rule, mask wearing, use of sanitizer and QR codes, optimal ventilation of indoor spaces, and no congregational singing. **Also, we recommend you ring your Mass contact to pre-book to attend Sunday Masses to avoid disappointment. Booking details are on the front page of this bulletin.** 

It will be wonderful for us to be able to gather once more as faith communities to celebrate the Eucharist after such a prolonged period away. And on another bright note, we have just received news from the Bishop's Office this week that Fr George Anthicadu will be taking over the helm in our region as our new Parish Priest from early November. So, we look forward to welcoming Fr George in the coming weeks and at the same time farewelling Fr John Purnell who unfortunately will be leaving us to serve the Morisset Parish community. Fr 'Johnno' with his relaxed manner and sense of humour will be greatly missed by all of us. Fr Graham and I have been asked to stay on here in the Maitland Region to support Fr George. I would like to thank everyone in our communities, especially our parish teams along with my fellow priests, for your incredible support to me in my role as Administrator here since December last year. Its been both a challenging and rewarding time for me.

A number of our parishioners have joined Fr Graham and myself over recent Sundays for zoom link-ups. These will now have to cease to due to us returning to our regular busy Mass schedules. We thank you for your gracious support with these and in so many other ways: your prayers, phone calls, emails, financial support and so forth. Finally, just to let you know our Parish Office will not re-open for a few more weeks, though our friendly office staff will be available to answer phone calls and respond to emails. And please don't forget to check our website for updates.
