A reading from the first book of the Kings

The widow made a little scone from her flour meal and brought it to Elijah.

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said, 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives', she replied, 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel: "Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied. before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth." The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

## Second Reading Heb 9:24-28

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews Christ offered himself only once to take the faults of many on himself.

It is not as though Christ had entered a man-made sanctuary which was only modelled on the real one; but it was heaven itself, so that he could appear in the actual presence of God on our behalf. And he does not have to offer himself again and again, like the high priest going into the sanctuary year after year with the blood that is not his own, or else he would have had to suffer over and over again since the world began. Instead of that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

The more severe will be the sentence they receive.'

He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called to his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly,

this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'

# **Homily - Fr Graham Fullick**

The greatest deceit in trying to deceive others is our self-deceit. We deceive ourselves of the value of our actions in the sight of God who sees all and knows the motivations of our heart. We deceive ourselves about the power of God in this world until we realise that what worked as deceit and self-interest in this world does not ever please God eternally who sees all that is done in secret and rewards all that is done in secret, or punishes what is done looking good, but is done in comfort or selfishness. Today's world is a fake world of virtue signalling and weasel words. In today's world "reaching out" to someone sounds gallant like holding out a plank in a storm for them to hold onto to prevent them sinking, but it is actually just making a comfortable telephone call and not having a personal encounter or moving out of the comfort zone. It is all a matter of creating "good optics", setting an agenda of "care" of others while all the time caring only about looking good, not being good and doing good.

If we are truly good and want to be good and do good, then it starts with total commitment to God, denying our whole self, the whole pride-filled ago and letting God in to fill the void. The widow was the lowliest and most destitute yet made no show of giving all she had to God. In absolute terms it looked worthless compared to the ostentatious virtue-signalling of the man who put in what was comfortable. He did what was comfortable. She did what was difficult and required total commitment. She abandoned all to the providence of God in being providential to others. The rich man abandoned nothing to God, least of all his worldly reputation and worldly assets. He did not trust God and was not moved to unselfish love. The poor widow trusted God and emptied herself in the act. Her reward is eternal. His reward is spent, spent in this life.

To those parents who give and sacrifice invisibly for their children especially in virtue of religious worship and right conduct, and not mere "success", God sees it. To the teacher who quietly sets up a funding scheme for a poor child, God sees it. To the person who volunteers humbly from polishing Church brass to answering a St. Vincent de Paul call at 2:30am, God sees it. All these are little and accumulating white martyrdoms. To the person who gives their life or wellbeing for another in the cause of right for ANZAC day or in Saintliness for the salvation and sanctification of their neighbour after the Sacred Heart of Jesus, God knows it. God sees the pure motive and the impure motive. And that is all that matters, eternally.
