Homily - Fr Grahm Fullick

It was World War II, 10 November 1942, the second battle of El Alamein when Generals Alexander and Montgomery (as he then was) and their men (many Australians included) had turned back the German Rommel's Afrika Korps forces in Egypt and North Africa. The United Kingdom Prime Minister Winston Churchill (as he then was) made a speech: "Now this is not the end. It is not even the beginning of the end. But it is, perhaps, the end of the beginning. Henceforth Hitler's Nazis will meet equally well armed, and perhaps better armed troops." {churchillsociety-london.org.uk} It stands out that today the first Sunday, the beginning of Advent that we should have Jesus saying to us his disciples that we should be awake, praying at all times, watching ourselves, that we should not be coarsened by debauchery and drunkenness and that there will be signs of the end times. It should not however surprise us. In the course of salvation history, the Old Testament of the Law and the prophets is superseded by the New Testament who is a Person, Jesus the Christ for whose birthday we now prepare in Advent.

God is not distant because our heartbeat and soul are not distant! The Lord who is pure Spirit, the Holy Spirt of love, Love itself, had no reason to create time, the space in which we exist, yet He did. God the Father is being and existence itself, yet not physical. He had no reason to create physical us, except for Love, and so He did. He gave us free will and a conscience, the intellect of the soul to know love and worship Him wanting nothing but our eternal blessedness. Our soul is a unique gift of God of participation in the Divine Life of God, purely Spiritual, yet given to each one of us. But we were fallen and in need of salvation. Our free will was compromised as it was not given freely back to God. That was the big lapse in Adam and Eve-and us in our human inheritance: Original Sin. That was the beginning of the end, our downfall. We thought we could be gods ourselves without relationship with God, cut off and hiding. But this Jesus Christ who comes at Christ-Mass, and came as The Good News of Salvation in his Person (the 2nd Person of the Tri-Unity) came to put an end to the fallen beginning. He is the beginning of the end of the reign of Satan's darkness, the power of evil seen in death. Jesus comes that we may have life and have it to the full. He is the Christ of God, the anointed Messiah. He will re-open the gates of Heaven where the just may enter, because He and he alone being the God-Man can do so. Advent is the start of God's battle of Grace, of Pure Love in re-creating us from the soul out as His undivided flock. "Behold I stand at the door and knock". Prepare the way of the Lord. The straightening starts with a disciple's listening heart. Will you be sucked up by "silly season" noise? Or have a "silent night" with the ear of your soul listening, changing, repenting to the Saviour. Allow yourself to receive the Christ Mass gift of being re-created.
