LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading Bar 5:1-9

A reading from the prophet Baruch Jerusalem – God will show you splendour.

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Gospel Lk 3:1-6

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

All people shall see the salvation of God.

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness;
Prepare a way for the Lord,
make his paths straight.
Every valley will be filled in,
every mountain and hill be laid low,
winding ways will be straightened
and rough roads made smooth.
And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Homily—Fr Maurie Cahill Pressing the GO button.

Our main teacher for 2022 Gospel readings will be St. Luke. He will very soon be telling us the beautiful stories of Christmas; of Jesus, Son of God, our Messiah, slipping quietly into our world in the stillness of the Silent Night. The Holy Spirit's quiet preparations have been going on down the ages, calling chosen people, opening their hearts to God. But today begins with the story that the Lord Jesus' public mission is about to begin. It has been so long coming but with all being ready, the time has come. It is like God decides to press the GO button for the great work of the Son of Man is finally to begin. St. Luke wants his readers to know the date of this tremendous event of Teacher and Saviour. He places it accurately in history by citing the reign of certain important people of that time – like the emperor Tiberius and other important folk holding office. Hence, we know that it was in the year 27AD.

The great action begins as "the word came to John". This cousin of Jesus had been answering God's call, and been living, praying, and listening to what God was teaching him, alone in the wilderness. That seems to have been the lonely place where all the prophets before him had learned to open their hearts to God. And John came out of his desert retreat on fire with his powerful message. Get ready, he was proclaiming, for God's holy messenger. They must turn from sinful ways and open their hearts to him. He was telling them that the long-promised Messiah was already among them to found God's wondrous Kingdom – ready to judge and separate good from evil. John was a sensation.

John quotes the great prophet Isaiah: telling them to prepare the way of the Lord; make an easy path for him to come to them. He speaks of levelling the rough ways of the path so as to ease the strenuous climbing and scrambling. We are used to moving swiftly and smoothly along expressways. But for poor people, journeying in the ancient world, it was a big deal. With Isaiah, John is saying: no matter what the work or how difficult, open the way for the Lord to come. Many hearing John would have expected great & spectacular things in the coming of God's Kingdom. John's message was a forerunner of Jesus' own message: that the only place worth working was in the human heart. Until hearts are right, even God can't bring in his kingdom of truth and justice. No matter what the work, or how difficult - prepare for the Lord.

What a chaotic place our world can become without that word of the Lord.

The Church's greatest task is to prepare people's hearts for the Lord. Putting up churches, hospitals, schools; running programmes & organizations; feeding the poor, lifting up the impoverished: all of these matter. But the greatest work of all is preparing hearts to receive the Lord.

And the greatest contribution <u>we</u> make? It is to have our own hearts open to the Lord; so that this great wonderful Jesus, the Messiah that John went ahead of, would be Lord of our life.
