#### LITURGY OF THE WORD First Reading Is 60:1-6

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The glory of the Lord shines upon you. Arise, shine out, Jerusalem, for your light has come, the glory of the Lord is rising on you, though night still covers the earth and darkness the peoples. Above you the Lord now rises and above you his glory appears. The nations come to your light and kings to your dawning brightness. Lift up your eyes and look round: all are assembling and coming towards you, your sons from far away and your daughters being tenderly carried. At this sight you will grow radiant, your heart throbbing and full: since the riches of the sea will flow to you; the wealth of the nations come to you; camels in throngs will cover you, and dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; everyone in Sheba will come, bringing gold and incense and singing the praise of the Lord. from sea to sea, from the Great River to earth's bounds. (R.)

You have probably heard how I have been entrusted by God with the grace he meant for you, and that it was by a revelation that I was given the knowledge of the mystery. This mystery that has now been revealed through the Spirit to his holy apostles and prophets was unknown to any men in past generations; it means that pagans now share the same inheritance, that they are parts of the same body, and that the same promise has been made to them, in Christ Jesus, through the gospel.

## Gospel Mt 2:1-12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

We have come from the East to worship the king.

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him, 'for this is what the prophet wrote: And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means

least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.' Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

#### The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

#### Homily - Fr Maurie Cahill

EPIPHANY. Matthew reflects on his own story.

I believe that the 'wise men' were star-gazers from the orient. They had seen a strange new star. For them, it meant one thing - the birth of a king. So, they set out to follow their star. And after many nights travelling, they came to the capital, Jerusalem, and the evil King Herod. A bad mistake! But they followed on, and eventually were led right to Bethlehem. What a beautiful story of the wise men and their camels persistently following on, and discovering the Christ child. I, Matthew, only had a scroll to work on to record my story. There wasn't any technology of painting & printing in my day or I would have put that dramatic picture on the front of my pamphlet. But artists have been painting the scene ever since.

My 'painting in words' captures just what my gospel is all about. All the music and poetry of that baby's life is in my story. See how it wasn't any of the child's own people who found him at Bethlehem. It was these pagan foreigners. And those wise Magi knelt in homage: That was a sign of things to come.

I am telling you that this child would be a light to all the nations, while so many of our own people would reject him and not accept Jesus as our Messiah.

After they fall down to give him HOMAGE, came the gifts they had carried from afar.

Do you notice those gifts? They tell so much:

- \* GOLD gold was for a king. The child is royalty of great king David's family, destined truly to reign.
- \* FRANKINCENSE: it used to waft through the temple during worship of God; this small child is so much more than just a human babe. There was a divineness about him.
- \* MYRRH used to be for burial rites. That tells us that ultimately his death would be tremendously important.

'Do a Magi' What of your HOMAGE? Have a think what special offering you can bring along, that can go in the chalice at Mass on this special feast day, and be offered up with the very life of Jesus, our Lord and King. What we bring might seem small, but that way, it can become pure gold. I hope you can ponder and enjoy my story. It will bless you.
