#### **Gospel** Lk 2:41-52

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

His parents found him in the temple, sitting among the learned men, listening to them.

Every year the parents of Jesus used to go to Jerusalem for the feast of the Passover. When he was twelve years old, they went up for the feast as usual. When they were on their way home after the feast, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem without his parents knowing it. They assumed he

was with the caravan, and it was only after a day's journey that they went to look for him among their relations and acquaintances. When they failed to find him they went back to Jerusalem looking for him everywhere. Three days later, they found him in the Temple, sitting among the doctors, listening to them, and asking them questions; and all those who heard him were astounded at his intelligence and his replies. They were overcome when they saw him, and his mother said to him, 'My child, why have you done this to us? See how worried your father and I have been, looking for you.' 'Why were you looking for me?' he replied. 'Did you not know that I must be busy with my Father's affairs?' But they did not understand what he meant. He then went down with them and came to Nazareth and lived under their authority. His mother stored up all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom, in stature, and in favour with God and men.

# Homily - Fr Graham Fullick

In St. Luke's account of Joseph and Mary losing Jesus in the Jerusalem temple and not noticing for three days, we can focus on the little and big angsts of parenthood. Earlier this year at the top of our Hunter Valley a young boy with autism was lost on a farm and then found. His parents were subjected to Police investigation for months. I certainly remember my mum and dad taking my twin brother and I to the Sydney Royal Easter show when we were 4 years old and being obviously concerned to keep us near them, pointing out the "good policemen and women to go to and ask if you can't find mummy or daddy" and they kept turning around checking on us. We can exalt Mary and Joseph in their sainthood, but they are truly human with it. They did not yet understand what their 12 year old Son meant when he said "I must be in my Father's house". They certainly had great anxiety. Yet Mary treasured all these things in her heart. What she did not understand in her head she treasured in her soul. That is an attitude of encounter and journey in life, of submitting to God in raising children to be brought by the vicissitudes and felicity of life in this realisation of parental fallibility to the infallibility of God's love for us! There is the three day physical search, no doubt churning in their stomachs. But there is the inner eternal journey and celebration of realising that God in His Son is showing them the Son's journey of faith and commitment to our and their salvation.

This happening is the first showing of what the incarnation, God becoming Man at Christmas truly means. Mary and Joseph not only lived with it in Jesus; they rolled with it. So we move from the angsts of parenthood to Jesus, the human Revelation of the Father's Glory, truly God and truly Man, Emmanuel, "God is with us" on Earth. This is beyond encounter. This will transform the whole of humanity as salvation is dawning—they just have to come to terms with this and ponder it. And so do we. Especially as they and we can take some R&R at this time. "Redemption & Reflection" amidst the "Rest & Relaxation". The perfection of human and Godly wisdom is now seen in the Jesus Mary and Joseph have been raising in righteous fashion, going to Jerusalem for the Passover these last 12 years. In his perfect humanity and divinity Jesus going about His Father's work, in His house. Jesus is instructing his dad and mum about why we go to church, as church, to receive the Wisdom of God even as he is also THE Wisdom of God. This is the absolute beauty of the incarnation lived out in Jesus and in the Holy Family. That is why it is "the" Holy Family. Jesus was not disobedient to them in staying in the temple enthralled in jointly developing His Godly mission of salvation and human understanding, appropriating its meaning. He was obedient to the 5th. Commandment. What he realised was that he had developing power and prowess as He became a teenager. And yet He had the wisdom to know He too should treasure in His soul also the love of His parents who had brought Him in His humanity to this divine understanding that astonished all in the Temple. Blessed be the loving youth, seeking meaning in God and using both parents and Church, both the wisdom of God. Let us incarnate the faith in our homes, the domestic Temple of Jerusalem.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.
I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins
and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead
and the life of the world to come. Amen.
