The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses.

Gospel Jn 2:1-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The first of the signs given by Jesus was at Cana in Galilee.

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said, 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among

the Jews; each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them, 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from — only the servants who had drawn the water knew — the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink, but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Homily - Fr John Lovell

What are the implications for us of the first public miracle and sign of Jesus given at the Wedding at Cana? Well, think of those **six** huge stone jars that Jesus told the servants to fill with water. What did they represent?

In the first account of creation given in the first chapter of the Bible, we are told God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. These six days represent all of human history, since God's creative work continues (including through us) till the end of time, when the eternal Sabbath rest (the 7th day) begins. There have also been six covenants between God and humanity, which are as follows:

- 1. With Adam and Eve to eat from any tree except the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil
- 2. With Noah and every creature never to flood the Earth again
- 3. With Abraham and his descendants to be with them for ever
- 4. With Moses and the Israelites the tablets of the Law (keeping the Commandments)
- 5. With David to preserve the line of his Kingship forever
- 6. In Christ's Blood (the Blood of the new and everlasting covenant)

We don't know who that particular couple were whose wedding Jesus along with His mother and disciples attended at Cana that day. But their names don't really matter to us. What is most important is Jesus' presence at that event and what it signifies more broadly. His attendance, along with His mother and the disciples, and His miracle involving the six great jars of water, can be seen as a sign of all human history and God's covenants being blessed and brought to fruition through the transforming presence of Jesus in our midst. Although our relationship with God has been a troubled one at times, it has been a partnership, a courtship, a preparation for that time when *we* (His Bride) will be united with *Him* (our Groom) forever in the Heavenly Kingdom, which is described in the last book of the Bible as the 'wedding feast of the Lamb'.

The Nicene Creed

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven (All Bow) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried,

in accordance with the Scriptures.
He ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory
to judge the living and the dead
and his kingdom will have no end.
I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son is adored and
glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.
I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.
I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins
and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead
and the life of the world to come. Amen.
