First Reading Is 6:1-8

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Here am I! Send me.

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings.

And they cried out to one another in this way,

'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.'

The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said: 'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips

and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts.'

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said:

'See now, this has touched your lips, your sin is taken away,

your iniquity is purged.'

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saving: 'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?'

I answered, 'Here I am, send me.' The Word of the Lord Thanks be to God

Second Reading 1 Cor 15:1-11

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

I preach what they preach, and this is what you believe.

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you - believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures: that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died: then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it. I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others: but what matters is that I preach what they preach. and this is what you all believed.

Gospel Lk 5:1-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

They left everything and followed him.

Jesus was standing one day by the lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats – it was Simon's – and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Homily Fr George Anthicad

In today's gospel we see the fullness and the emptiness. The shore is filled with the people because of the presence of Jesus and there is emptiness in the boats and hearts of Simon and his companions. As soon as Jesus stepped into one of the boats of Simon, Jesus fills his heart with word of god and his boats with fish. There is no more emptiness when Jesus is present. He is the one who fills all kinds of vacuums in our life. He is the one who takes our life into the next level. He has got a plan for all of us.

To realize God's plan in our life we must trust in the words of our Lord and be ready to take risk like Simon did when Jesus asked him to put out the net into the deep water. Risk taking requires that we move out of our comfort zone with no guarantee of success. By taking calculated risks, we eventually overcome our fear of failure and replace them with the thrill of accomplishment.

There are reasons for everything that happens in our life, for success or for failure. In our failures we must turn to the Lord to gain strength. Always we have to remind us that God allows us to experience failures for a higher purpose.

No matter what we do, our ultimate goal is to achieve happiness in our life. Like every fisherman Simon also was dreaming of a great catch. And it happened one day when he met Jesus. But in reality, that great catch didn't give him the lasting happiness. Even at that moment of great success Simon was not happy. He was missing something in his life and Jesus is helping him to find that missing piece.

In our success we have to follow our Lord to reach the next level in our life. Don't be caught up by the temporary success and loose the lasting happiness in our life. Let us be always open to the Lord and for his guidance both in our success and failures. Jesus is inviting us to the endless possibilities. We have to see beyond our routine and learn to walk with Jesus with faith.

The Nicene Creed I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven (<i>All Bow</i>) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day	in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
