LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading Acts 10:34. 37-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Gospel Jn 20:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The teaching of scripture is that he must rise from the dead.

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

HOMILY—Fr Graham Fullick

"There is No Resurrection without the Cross." Good Friday Passion of our Lord.

The Renovation of the human will in Jesus' perfect will. In so many ways our salvation from the effects of original sin (hurt, pain, loss and death) was foretold in the prophets and especially in Moses' and the Jewish people's journey. In God, the Author of life, being and existence, Life itself, our journey of life, all lives, has and have a destination: Salvation. Salvation is the culmination of the Revelation of God's love. God the Father is Love itself (1st Person of the Trinity), and the pure Holy Spirit of Love (3rd Person of the Trinity). In Jesus, that Love in the Son (2nd Person of the Trinity) is made manifest and lived in the Incarnation and in His Death for our Salvation. The Law of righteousness comes through Moses, but Righteousness Himself is in Jesus. "Grace and truth came through Jesus Christ." As the Jews wandered 40 years in the desert, they were thirsty and came across an oasis, but its water was bitterly salty: *marah*. The people grumbled and God spoke to Moses at Marah and led him to throw a large branch of wood into the water—and it became sweet, drinkable. (Exod. 15:22-25 to 16:35.) Then they received Bread, manna from Heaven like the dew, and quails to eat. And to rid them of snakes, Moses raised a bronze serpent on a cross—and they left. (Cf. John 3:14-15 and Numb. 21:9.)

St. Ambrose (*On the Mysteries* N12-16.9) tells us that "water without the proclamation of the Cross of the Lord is of no avail for future salvation; but after it has been consecrated by the mystery of the Saving Cross, it is made ready to serve as a spiritual washing and as a cup of salvation.". The beauty of the Good Friday death is that God's Goodness in Jesus' perfect will takes on our irredeemable totality of sins in our fallen nature and re-novates us: We do not become God, but we are given now a share in the overflowing Love, the *hesed* mercy of God: Redemption. Jesus' Cross is the "piggy back", the vicarious atonement we receive, washing over our fallenness with His blood. It only happens because of the perfectly faithful obedience of Jesus who in that act of total submission of perfect human will becomes the Christ of our Redemption. It takes effort to be good, but it is ultimately worthwhile for eternity. Let us be faithful to God with the extraordinary Grace of the Cross as our Lord was faithful. "This is My commandment: Love one another as I have loved you." A pure heart create for me O God!

"There is No Cross without Resurrection." The Easter Resurrection of our Lord.

The Restoration of the human home of Heaven. Life has new and eternal meaning now that Christ has been raised from the dead. He gave His life for us so that He might take up His own life again and re-open the gates of Paradise closed through disobedience. Jesus completely heals and makes us participants in God's victory over death. Lord give me this Faith Hope and Love; the conviction and certainty that for those who are faithful, Eternity of the Blessed Vision of Heaven with You is real. Let us live and act with Jesus' love now: Pure love of the Father and of neighbour, for we are adopted into eternal life by Jesus. There is a reward and promise of Eternal Goodness for us who strive now to worship God in spirit and in truth and love our neighbour as Jesus did. "There are many mansions in My Father's house and I go now to prepare a place for you... For where I have gone, I want you to follow." Have a Blessed Easter of New Life in Christ everyone!
