When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native Parthians, Medes language? Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God.

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

Homily - Fr Maurice Cahill

Sing for the Spirit

We celebrate the birthday of the Church, as the Holy Spirit is lavishly poured out. Jesus had not laid any plans on his disciples, as to how they were to get the Church up and running. They had to wait and pray; they had to have their hearts open. And when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, you will receive power.

And come it did. What a birthday of the new Kingdom of God; - and the Church starts with a burst of fire & an ecstatic joy of Presence. A burst of sheer power shook the place - and shook them out of fear and opened wide hesitant hearts. They burst into an exuberant chorus of praise. And they wanted to tell the world about it.

Jesus' Church was up and running. The Lord delights in using the weak & making them strong.

The great teacher, St. Athanasius, speaks to us from the 4th century: "The Lord calls all those he has redeemed to sing a hymn of victory". Our Church is made up of weak and sinful people who have been touched by the power of Jesus' own Holy Spirit. So let our hearts sing of victory.

The Lord's great gift of the Spirit is poured out at our baptism. He inspires all the gifts that St. Paul talks about; he empowers in people a spirit of love and peace, patience and tolerance; a people who know how to pray. But hearts must stay open to that power. We know that there are lots of 'baptised pagans' who seem to be untouched by the call of the Spirit in their lives. And we witness the troubles that abound around us and, even more so, in the world at large. Without the guidance the Spirit gives, all the old enemies of mankind boldly strut the stage, causing chaos and suffering.

Jesus speaks of his Spirit as "the spirit of truth." The Spirit comes so that we not only know but understand more deeply the mystery of Jesus among us, and to live by it in our hearts. I believe that perhaps the greatest truth he would teach each of us is WHO I AM. The great, great truth is that I am a brother/sister of the Lord Jesus. His Spirit has gathered me into an intimate relationship with members of the Divine Family; his heavenly Father is also my father, who loves me as part of the great love he has for His Son, Jesus. So, I must not be afraid. I know that the person I am is precious in his sight. So let me sing in my heart the song of victory.

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages.

Message from Fr Graham Fullick

May-June Worship of God and Pastoral Care.

Dear Brothers- and Sisters-in-Christ,

We are just past the half-way point of having "half" a full-time priest to care for the largest Catholic region in our diocese. We have completed May and have drawn the June rosters for public weekday and Sunday Masses. There were 50 scheduled Sunday Masses in our 8 churches in May and there are 40 Sunday Masses in June. Of these 90, 5 will have been Sunday full Communion services with ordained clergy, deacon, and 85 of 90 will have been Sunday Masses with (as Jesus requires) ordained clergy, priest. For the 21 weekday Masses in May and 22 in June, we have had to cancel 2 Masses in May and 3 in June because of unavoidable illness or emergency. In all we have had and will have 38 of 43 full weekday Masses offered by a priest. At this point may I on your and Fr. George's behalf deeply thank firstly Fr. Maurice Cahill and Frs. Greg Arnold, Joseph Figurado, Kevin Kiem, Victor Martinez *Op. Dei*, Camillus Nwahia, John Purnell, Joyce Sebastian, and Dcns. Gerard McCarthy and Viane Perez. And also those other priests, so many, who have supported with calls and Apostolic love. If young people knew the dedication to help out like this, they would see that God in Jesus from the beginning inspires and drives this ordained love and service.

All 8 sessions of regular Saturday Confessions have been kept plus unseen booked and impromptu Confessions. 7 of 8 Expositions and Adorations of the Blessed Sacrament will have happened though 1 of 8 will have been on Thursday instead of Friday. Every requested and of course urgent, end of life Sacramental Anointing and visits to hospitals, nursing homes and private homes for Anointing from Mater Waratah to Calvary Nulkaba, up to 3 a day at any hour have been kept. All scheduled Baptisms have been kept again with diaconal help and also Fr. Anthony Coloma. There are RCIA, administration, finance, Sacraments of Initiation, Confirmations this month and other things not treated here yet but happening all the while! Unfortunately for Catholic School particular Masses (outside the 133 rostered Masses already available) and general nursing home Masses and personal Holy Communion visits, it has not been possible to maintain these in parts of May-June while Fr. Anthicad PP is away on deserved leave visiting his mother and family (after 4 years) in India and I am on decree-approved amended duties so as to care for my father, Greg. Thank you for your prayers, forbearance, patience, food charity of Sr. Jenny, All Saints College, parishioners and solicitude, not public, but known to God. I really miss the Schools and Nursing Homes. God is glorified in Christian worship and love of neighbour. We will celebrate Fr. George's Anniversary and Birthday when he returns. We await with thanks, Fr. John Vo Vien my senior brother as Assistant Priest.

Funerals are ongoing and unpredictable. Just over a month from 6 May and projecting a little to 6 June, 2022 we have had 17 funerals with more to come. May I on your and Fr. George's behalf deeply thank Ann Warrilow co-ordinator and all the Bereavement Team members for our funerals and those offering Masses and Prayer Services so far: Lay, Irene Dixon (1), Dcn. Gerard McCarthy (2), Dcn. Viane Perez (1), Fr. John Lovell (2), Fr. George Anthicad (2), Fr. Geoff Mulhearn (1), Fr. James Lunn (1), Fr. Camillus Nwahia (2), Fr. Joyce Sebastian (2), Fr. Thomas Zaranba (1), and Bishop Brian Mascord (2). May the Lord richly reward you, and may the Souls Rest In Peace eternally.

Thank you to Very. Rev. Fr. Adm. Greg Barker for his care of our region among so many contingencies across the diocese which we do not know of, but must in charity *consider* and *share* in Christian solidarity and subsidiarity. We look forward to Confirmations with Frs. Barker and Figurado. Thank you to all our varied Grace-filled and encouraging Religious Sisters so solid, Parish Teams, volunteers, sacristans, musicians and people performing quiet spiritual and corporal works of Mercy throughout our parishes. Finally, thank you deeply to our Chisholm staff Louise Gilchrist, Janine Sidoti, Sandra Buck, Bec Piefke and Maree O'Reilly.
