Lk 9:11-17

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

They all ate and were filled.

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in

parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.

The Gospel of the Lord

Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Homily - Fr Graham Fullick

In the Breviary (Prayer of the Church; Office of the Hours) on the Blessed Sacrament, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ (*Corpus Christi*) whose Solemnity we celebrate today there are two keys into this mystery of why we see only the accidents of bread and wine but receive the substance of All Christ, *Corpus Christi*. The Lord said to Moses: While my glory passes by, I will put you in a crevice of the rock and cover you with my hand until I have passed by; for no man may see God and live. Likewise, we too cannot "see" the Resurrected Jesus now and live as that is in the afterlife. But we see him in Jesus' Body and Blood in the Blessed Sacrament: Host and Precious Blood. Each contains the other fully. There is a glimpse of the glory of God to come in the Transfiguration of Jesus.

No one has ever seen God in the way Jesus participates in the same substance of Godhead, but God's only Son who is nearest to the Father's heart, has made him known. Jesus is more present to us now in the Eucharistic Presence as it is the Resurrected, Victorious God we receive through all the gifts of the Holy Spirit of Father and Son.

Venerable Fr. John Hardon SJ said Jesus is substantially present in the Blessed Sacrament: Real Presence. Yes, God is everywhere, but look at the difference between a phone call, letter, video conference, Skype call to London or New York with your family versus being there and hugging them, playing with them, eating with them, spouses together. Jesus weds heaven to Earth in the Blessed Sacrament, the sacrament to which all the others are ordered. The marriage of the Lamb of God and the bridegroom. Jesus has made himself ready for his bride, the Church. Let us become what we eat. More Eucharistic, Thanksgiving, Worshipping, empty of Pride and allow ourselves to offer ourselves like Jesus totally back to the Father in humility and in the Eternal Food we receive, receive Christ and be more Christian when we leave Mass today and this week. "O Sacrament Most Holy, O Sacrament Divine, all Praise and all Thanksgiving be every moment Thine."

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead

and the life of the world to come. Amen.
