### The Epic Faith Journey.

Father Therry kept a diary of his work in our very early Church. His efforts were heroic! One entry records his hearing that a number of Irishmen were to be executed at Maitland. He was refused passage on the small, once-aweek government steamer. His own words tell the story.

I started on horseback with a trusted Irish friend. After travelling uninterruptedly for a day and a night we reached Maitland at five o'clock on the morning fixed for the execution. I at once set about preparing the men for death. I then celebrated Mass, administered Holy Communion to them, and, in a few hours afterwards, attended at their execution. This was the first Mass celebrated in the Hunter district.

Fr. Therry's Journal tells of his visits from Sydney, way up towards Queensland, discovering Catholic folk; how he would say Mass in their humble shanties. He often discovered great faith among the many scattered Catholics of those very early days, "hanging on to the Faith against all odds".

We might ask: what pleases God more: a grand liturgy in Rome, or the humble bush liturgies of Fr. Therry with a few faith-filled poor folk? The Eucharist is Jesus offering himself – the same wherever it be; and everything else, beautiful as it might be, is an *add-on*; just so long as we have people of faith.

<u>Belief</u> is often not the same as <u>faith</u>. We all believe in prayer – or we would not be here today. Yes, God does listen to our prayers. But asking with confidence that he listens and acts in some way here and now: That is faith. Jesus says even a little bit of Faith (like the mustard seed) can move that mulberry tree – or a mountain.

Sure, we believe in the one Presence of Christ in Holy Communion. And we know that our reception of the Lord Jesus can be matter-of-fact, without a whole lot of thought. Our Faith can be like the extra dimension, that moves us beyond a general belief. Faith is where we act with real conviction that the Lord himself is really at our disposal. It is a movement of our heart, a welcoming, and trusting.

When assembled people move beyond belief into deep faith - that is when things happen.

Lord, increase our faith, that our belief comes alive as we place ourselves in your presence.

### **Apostles' Creed**
