This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'

# Homily - Prepared by Fr John Vo Vien

#### APPRECIATE THE GOODNESS OF THE LORD

To illustrate a lack of gratitude Winston Churchill liked to recount the story of a sailor who, in the dead of winter, saw a little boy fall from the pier to which his boat tied. Not heeding his own safety the sailor dived in to rescue the boy. He brought him to safety before he froze, and saved his life.

Someone on the pier recognized the boy, wrapped him in a blanket and offered to take him home, and the sailor quickly returned to his boat to change into something warm.

Two days later the boy and his mother returned to the pier looking for the sailor. They found him, and the boy's mother asked, "Are you the man who rescued my son?

"Yes. I am" he replied.

Then she demanded, "Then where is his hat?

When studying English, I realized that two of the most beautiful words in English are "sorry" and "thank you". I know that I say sorry when I make a small or serious mistake, and say "thank you" to those who have done good to me or helped me in my needs. But, in some cases, it is not easy to say "sorry" or "thank you" at all.

More importantly, most of the times I forget to thank God for His many blessings, and sometimes I complain about why He has not given me more.

In today's readings, we are reminded of the importance of gratitude to God for everything we have received from Him.

In the first reading, when Naaman, a commander of the Syrian army and a Gentile, realised that he had been healed, he returns to Elisha's house, stands before the prophet, and makes his confession of faith in Israel's God and offers a gift in thanksgiving.

In the Gospel, Jesus performed a miracle by healing 10 lepers including nine Jews and a Samaritan, a foreigner who was hated by the Jewish people of the time. Ten were healed physically of their leprosy. But only one returned to give thanks and praise to God. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus ask: "Where are the other nine?" It is a sad story for Jesus but a great example for each of us to learn to become grateful people.

"O God, You have given us so much. Give us one more thing – a grateful heart".
