And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?' 'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name - and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Homily - Fr Graham Fullick

Lk 21 5 19 Do Not be Deceived End Times 131122

The week leading up to this Gospel, Jesus has been saying (with Holy Church's canon of Scripture and Mass) that the Mystery of our Redemption is with us now—Himself. That He is the Earthly Temple of God and Revelation of the Father, and that we are to be living stones on an Apostolic foundation from He who is the stone rejected, but Who has become our cornerstone of the Church He founded in His Precious Redeeming blood and in the water flowing from His side. The end is "here, but not yet", in Jesus. We are in the in-between times. Moreover, Jesus left us the continuing, glorious and resurrected Sacrifice of the Mass of His Real Presence: Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity; until He comes again. This Real Presence abides until the Consummation of the world in God. The Grace meanwhile continues in the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete, Advocate for our perseverance in faith. The "End" is here already. The end is a person, Jesus Christ. He is to be our true and good end, not as in death, but as the source and focus of our life poured out back to Him in self-offering in the Mass and in a life spent for His glory. That is our great vocation, just like His poured out, back to His heavenly Father for our salvation.

The Church is nothing if not a community of believers called to be a Communion of faithful and faith filled followers of Christ, our Source and Summit in the Mass and in this life. We are between Christ's Resurrection and His Second Coming, the Parousia. Our good ends, all the good we can be and become, living saints, come about only through our conformation to Jesus Christ. We pray that His will be our will. How hard that is! And yet how many sacramental helps of the Grace of the Holy Spirit and the Blessed Sacrament to which all the others and our life itself is directed and given life. If we let God be in us, if we are peaceful and peaceable making time for prayerful contemplation, spending time IN the Lord, letting Him dwell in us and we be but temples for His dwelling then we will have serenity even amidst the greatest tribulations of life. In our tribulations could we say "Father forgive them they know not what they do?"—even as we give witness knowing that we are about God and have His Holy Spirit, our Supreme Help.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, (all bow) born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead;

he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
