From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul? For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.

#### Gospel Mt 4:12-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

He went to Capernaum, that the prophecy of Isaiah be fulfilled.

Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled: Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali!, Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan, Galilee of the nations! The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned.

From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they left their nets at once and followed him.

Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him.

He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.

## Homily for Australia Day by Fr Maurie Cahill

The Beginnings: On 13 May 1787, 236 years ago. a fleet of 11 ships, which came to be known as the First Fleet, was sent by the British Admiralty from England to Australia. Under the command of Captain Arthur Phillip. The fleet sought to establish a penal colony at Botany Bay on the coast of New South Wales.

But poor land, without freshwater awaited the fleet at Botany Bay. Eventually, in a magnificent Harbour, Philip found a pretty cove with fresh water. Philip named the place Sydney Cove, after a dithering home secretary, Viscount Sydney. There they planted a British flag and claimed the land for King George 11 – thereby proclaiming the land as 'terra nullius', belonging to no one. That was one great legal fiction.

The aboriginals around the harbour shores were of the GADIGAL Peoples – resident there for many thousands of years. The locals soon came to realise that these very strange intruders had come to stay. There was not one of them who wanted to be there, yet right there saw the beginnings of the nation, which eventually came to be called Australia.

We have history of an immensely cruel and inhuman suffering for convicts. And truly terribly so for Aborigines. The idea that they quietly retreated is so wrong; they stayed 'stubbornly' attached to their tribal land. We are still coming to terms with our terrible history of injustice to them.

So, though we do have much to repent, and put right, today we do have much for which to give thanks. In the space of a rather few lifetimes, the nation has come an incredible way since the times of our hardy pioneers. Internationally, we are rated as having one of the world's very high living standards. Therefore, our national day reminds us of our need to be caring for the less fortunate of our citizens. We Catholics remember our forebears who hung desperately to their faith, so that they could hand it on to us.

Pope JP11, 1986, in Alice Springs. His teaching gives us all food for thought. He speaks of our past injustices done to our indigenous citizens.

Certainly, what has been done cannot be undone. But what can now be done to remedy the deeds of yesterday must not be put off till tomorrow.

Christian people of good will are saddened to realize – many of them only recently – for how long a time Aboriginal people were transported from their homelands into small areas or reserves where families were broken up, tribes split apart, children orphaned and people forced to live like exiles in a foreign country. Much today still requires a just and proper settlement that still lies unachieved.

Some 30 years back, Pope JP2 seemed so prophetic. We are speaking today of giving a VOICE to our indigenous brothers and sisters. Much has been achieved in those 30 years. And there are many strong and heroic people working for the just future for all our peoples. May the Lord bring us to unity.
