Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'lawbreaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

The demands of discipleship can be very difficult. The strength that is needed to continue on the chosen path despite its hardships can come only from God. We live in a world that desperately needs to hear the call to conversion, but it is a world that is subject to the death that entered it through the sin of Adam. Those who answer the call of God may have to face the hostility of this world, because their values and their commitment to righteousness threaten its moorings. To commit oneself to the reign of God is to challenge the reign of the world, and this can make one very unpopular. In the midst of this suffering we can find strength in the promises of God, and we believe that God is faithful to these promises. Only half of today's picture is bleak. The other half is radiant with hope. Paul assures us that the gracious gift that God offers us is far greater that the transgressions brought on by sin. This gracious gift is Jesus Christ himself. The gift exceeds anything for which we might have hoped. He is the comfort that will carry us through our disappointments. He is the strength that will enable us to endure the misunderstanding and hardship that come with discipleship. We are called to acknowledge him before the world, and we are promised that if we do, he will acknowledge us before God. There is light even in the midst of darkness.

SAFEGUARDING

The historical management of complaints of abuse have received fierce criticism. Not only our Church but Government and other religious entities did not act in a legal or ethical manner when dealing with complaints and knowledge of abuse. This standard clearly demonstrates that, as an organisation, the Australian Catholic church has changed, and it acknowledges the historical issues and has willingly embraced and extended the recommendations of relevant Royal Commissions. This standard does not exist on paper alone, each entity must show compliance with every criterion.

STANDARD SIX

EFFECTIVE complaints management

Competency: Processes for raising concerns and complaints are responsive, understood, accessible and used by children, adults, families, carers, communities, and personnel.

Criteria 6.1 The entity's Complaints Handling Policy outlines the roles and responsibilities, approaches to dealing with different types of complaints, reporting obligations and record keeping requirements. **Comment:** The four types of complaints are defined as:

- "breaches of Codes of Conduct;
- disclosures, allegations, or concerns of current abuse of a child;
- an adult bringing forward a complaint of abuse suffered as a child; and
- an adult bringing forward a complaint of current or past abuse experienced as an adult.'

Criteria 6.2 The entity has a child-focused complaints handling system that is understood by children, families, carers and personnel.

Criteria 6.3 Complaints are taken seriously and responded to promptly and thoroughly

Criteria 6.4 The Complaints Handling Policy includes the process of reporting complaints and concerns to relevant authorities, requiring cooperation with any statutory or contractual processes.

Criteria 6.5 The Church Authority ensures mechanisms are in place to support complainants of child and adult sexual abuse.

Criteria 6.6 The Church Authority ensures respondents facing allegations are supported and monitored.
