Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

The readings for this feast do not directly explain the doctrine of the Trinity as we have come to know it. Rather, they offer us glimpses into the nature of our Triune God. The psalm response suggests that our primary response to God should be one of praise for the love that God has for us.

The God who is beyond our comprehension is also the God who has saved us. We see this theme in both the first reading and the gospel. The covenant language in the reading from Exodus underscores God's unfathomable goodness. God's graciousness and mercy are not rewards for our fidelity. They are extended to us in our sinfulness. It is God's saving grace that transforms us, not any merit on our part. In the gospel we are assured that Jesus was sent into the world to save it, not to condemn it.

The Trinitarian phrase found in the letter to the Corinthians is so expressive of the love that God has for us that it has been incorporated regularly into the liturgy. It declares that through his death and resurrection, Jesus has opened for us the treasury of divine grace. It also proclaims that the love of God has forged the bonds of community that unite us. Created in the image and after the likeness of this God, we are called to unity among ourselves. As incomprehensible as it may seem, it is primarily through the unity that we share that we will manifest the unity that exists in God.

Dianne Bergant CSA was a Professor of Biblical Studies at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, where she taught from 1978 to 2014. She holds a BS in Elementary Education from Marian College, Fond du Lac, WI; an MA and PhD in Biblical Languages and Literature from St Louis University. Amongst other things, she served as President of Catholic Biblical Association of America (2000-2001) and has been awarded honorary doctorates from several other universities. She was an active member of the Chicago Catholic/Jewish Scholars Dialogue (1988-2017) and sat on the editorial boards of The Bible Today (1979-2005), Biblical Theology Bulletin (1990-2014), Catholic Biblical Quarterly (1992-2001), New Theology Review (1997-2003), Teaching Theology and Religion (2003-2005), and Chicago Studies (2003-2009). She has taught and lectured in many places in the United States and abroad and has written numerous books, articles and chapters in books.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



SAFEGUARDING

Standard four focuses on building an ethos that is culturally safe and inclusive which fosters self-determination. This standard recognises diversity and inclusion. The moral authority of a society is evidenced in how the most vulnerable to treated. Further His Holiness Pope Francis wrote "the protection of minors and vulnerable persons is an integral part of the gospel message...Christ himself, in fact, has entrusted us with the care of the weakest and defenceless"

STANDARD FOUR

EQUITY IS PROMOTED AND DIVERSITY IS RESPECTED

Competency: Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected in policy and practice

Criteria 4.1 The diverse circumstances and backgrounds of children and adults at risk are acknowledged and accommodated by providing appropriate support.

Comment: This is a critical criterion as it demands that our policies and procedures result in action when a person at risk is identified. It also requires that the implementation of policy and procedure be conducted in a culturally safe manner.

Criteria 4.2 Children and adults have access to information, support and complaints processes in ways that promote inclusion, are culturally safe, and accessible.

Comment:. This should result in complaints been managed with the individual's cultural and diversity uniqueness in focus.

Criteria 4.3 The diverse needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, those living with disability, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, children and adults who are unable to live at home, and those of diverse sexuality, are acknowledged.

Comment: Requires that those responding to issues raised will respect the inherent dignity and be inclusive and responsive in attitude and actions.
