Diocesan Launch of the Jubilee Year – Sunday March 2

Bishop Michael writes to his priests and parishes:

"As you would be aware, extensive planning and progress has been taking place for our Diocesan Launch of the Jubilee Year. I am assured that our efforts and creativity are particularly unique to our Diocese, and I believe that the initiative will bolster us in hope as well as be a wonderful expression of hope to the people of our region. The pilgrimage will begin near Nobby's Beach at 8am tracking along the harbour front towards the Cathedral with assistance from local Police. We are hopeful that schools, parishes, and movements will carry their community banners and flags along the journey. At 10am we will celebrate mass followed by a 'Festival of Hope' in the Cathedral precinct. All food, activities, entertainment, and stalls will be free and will include access to an international exhibition of Blessed Carlo Acutis. We will also launch Project Compassion and make available all resources for this year's campaign.

The vision for this event which came from the Council of Priests is that it be a truly diocesan event involving the participation of clergy and faithful from all parishes of the Diocese. I ask you to please consider how you can encourage and facilitate the maximum participation of yourself and your parishioners in this event. This may include changing or even reducing your regular Sunday morning Mass times to facilitate parishioner participation and to enable your own participation. Please do what you can. I look forward to walking the pilgrimage with you and celebrating the Mass with you".

Following Bishop Michael's guidance, we encourage **maximum participation** from our **Chisholm region** in the **Diocesan Launch of the Jubilee Year** on **Sunday, 2nd March 2025**.

To accommodate this, and since our priests will be attending this significant diocesan event, the 8:00 AM Mass at Largs and the 8:30 AM Mass at East Maitland will be shortened to 30 minutes by reducing the length of the homily and hymns. These Masses are intended for parishioners who are unable to attend the diocesan program but still wish to fulfill their Sunday obligation.

Additionally, the **9:30 AM Sunday Mass at Paterson** on **2nd March 2025** will be **cancelled**. However, for those unable to attend the diocesan gathering, a **Liturgy of the Word and Holy Communion** will be organized at **Paterson at 9:30 AM** as an alternative.

All other Masses will remain unchanged.
