November Spiritual Bouquet – Praying for the Holy Souls

The Church dedicates the month of **November** to prayer for the **Holy Souls in Purgatory** — our brothers and sisters who have died in God's grace but may still be undergoing purification before entering the fullness of His heavenly glory.

Helping the Holy Souls

Our Catholic faith reminds us that death does not end our communion in Christ. Bound together in the Communion of Saints, we are called to support the faithful departed through our prayers, sacrifices, almsgiving, and above all, through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The Church teaches: At every Mass throughout the world, the Church intercedes for those who "have fallen asleep in the Lord."

Praying for the dead is a holy duty, rooted in Sacred Scripture (2 Maccabees 12:44–46; 2 Timothy 1:16–18) and reaffirmed by the Second Vatican Council (Lumen Gentium 49–50), which teaches that our spiritual union with those who have died is not broken but strengthened through the exchange of spiritual goods.

Spiritual Bouquet of Masses

This year, our parish will once again offer a Spiritual Bouquet of Masses throughout the month of November, with a special remembrance on 2 November - All Souls' Day - for the repose of the souls of our departed loved ones.

- November Mass Envelopes are available at the entrance of all our churches or within the Planned Giving envelope sets.
- Please write the names of those you wish to include in the Spiritual Bouquet on the envelope provided or place a separate list inside it.

Envelopes may be returned with the **Mass stipend** via the collection baskets or delivered directly to the **Chisholm** Region Parish Office.

With faith, love, and hope in God's mercy, let us assist the Holy Souls on their journey to eternal life, confident in the power of prayer offered in communion with the whole Church. This is the unity we profess each time we say in the Creed: "I believe in the Communion of Saints..."

"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen."

The Story of Youth Ministry in the Chisholm Region

Youth Ministry in the Maitland Region began in 2004 when Naomi Riley, inspired during Mass and navigating the loss of her father, felt called to create a Catholic youth group. At the time, the Baptist Youth Group in Rutherford was thriving, and Naomi saw a need for something similar in the Catholic community. With support from Fr Brian Mascord, Fr Tony Potts, Leon Warren and others, the first Young People's Mass launched in 2005, followed by junior and senior youth groups.

Momentum grew following World Youth Day in Cologne, Germany, with regular planning meetings and a growing team of dedicated volunteers including Greg Standing, Sue O'Donohue, Robyn Maher, and the Maher, O'Donohue, McGregor and Lancaster families. Highlights from those early years include the Journey of the World Youth Day Cross and Icon, outdoor Christmas Vigil Masses, and Good Friday Stations of the Cross. Music ministry, supported by Antioch and Iocal musicians, played a central role in creating a welcoming and prayerful space.

A major milestone came in 2009 with the appointment of the first official Youth Ministry Coordinator, Anne Maher. Under her leadership, the ministry expanded to new areas such as Largs, launched leadership programs like Sr Judy Bowe's Step Up, and ran creative outreach events like Battle of the Bands.

In 2012, the ACTiv8 Youth Team was formed—young adults living in community, supporting youth groups, leading school

programs, and beginning Wednesday morning prayer and adoration with Fr Paul O'Neill. That same year, new youth groups launched in Paterson and Lochinvar.

Inspired by the 2008 World Youth Day theme (Acts 1:8), ACTiv8 reflects a call to action—to activate faith in young people. It provides a place for youth aged 7 to 18 to build friendships, encounter Christ, and grow in faith through fun and inclusive

programs.

In 2013, Melissa Fenech became Youth Ministry Coordinator. That year, youth from the region travelled to World Youth Day in South America and attended the first Australian Catholic Youth Festival in Melbourne. The ministry was renamed ACTiv8 Chisholm Youth, with three guiding goals:

- To Encounter meeting young people where they are
- To Engage connecting them with programs and events
- To Encourage Active Participation empowering them to be involved in Church life

In 2014, the coordinator role was shared between Samantha Hill (Youth Groups, school ministry and engagement and youth Mass) and Stefanie Lloyd (Youth Team). In 2015, Bec Piefke stepped into the role and continues to lead the ministry today,

preparing children for sacraments, and running youth groups and Youth Masses, alongside a passionate team of volunteers.

Recently, Charlie Chedid and Danielle Mills have taken on leadership of the Largs Youth Group. The East Maitland Youth Group and Youth Mass have been blessed by the support of Sue O'Donohue, Sr Joseph, Alf Capito, Sue Jordan, Colleen Robertson, and Bev Bailey and previously Margaret Sheridan plus many other volunteers whose presence and service have been invaluable.

Many volunteers, past and present, have shaped this ministry. Special thanks to:

- Kade, the longest-standing youth participant, whose joyful commitment is an inspiration.
- · Anthony, who has cooked thousands of sausages over the years.
- Greenhills Daily Bakehouse, who generously donate sausages and bread each week.

Our music ministry remains a vital part of Youth Ministry, creating a prayerful and welcoming space every Sunday and Tuesday night. This ministry has been lovingly led by Sue, whose dedication over the years has been extraordinary.

Finally, we give thanks for the clergy, past and present, whose pastoral care and presence have guided this ministry, as well as our parish staff teams, whose unseen efforts and administrative support have made so much possible behind the scenes.

As we celebrate 20 years of Youth Ministry in the Maitland Catholic Region, we honour the countless volunteers, leaders, families, young people, and faithful supporters who have helped shape this beautiful story of faith, friendship, and mission.


