November Spiritual Bouquet – Praying for the Holy Souls

The Church dedicates the month of **November** to prayer for the **Holy Souls in Purgatory**—our brothers and sisters who have died in God's grace but may still be undergoing purification before entering the fullness of His heavenly glory.

Helping the Holy Souls

Our Catholic faith reminds us that death does not end our communion in Christ. Bound together in the Communion of Saints, we are called to support the faithful departed through our prayers, sacrifices, almsgiving, and above all, through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The Church teaches: At **every Mass** throughout the world, the Church intercedes for those who "have fallen asleep in the Lord."

Praying for the dead is a holy duty, rooted in Sacred Scripture (2 Maccabees 12:44–46; 2 Timothy 1:16–18) and reaffirmed by the Second Vatican Council (Lumen Gentium 49–50), which teaches that our spiritual union with those who have died is not broken but strengthened through the exchange of spiritual goods.

Spiritual Bouquet of Masses

This year, our parish will once again offer a Spiritual Bouquet of Masses throughout the month of November, with a special remembrance on 2 November - All Souls' Day - for the repose of the souls of our departed loved ones.

RCIA NEWS - Christian Initiation of Adults

Some of our parishes have the privilege of accompanying a group of people who have recently begun their journey of Christian Initiation. This presents us all with the opportunity to take up our responsibility as part of the parish community. As it says in the RCIA, 'the initiation of adults is the responsibility of all the baptised.' (n 9). The aim is for the Team and the parish leadership to work in collaboration with all of us (parishioners) together. The RCIA Team facilitates some aspects of the participants journey through hosting weekly gatherings focused on reflection on the Word of God and exploration of some aspects of our Catholic faith and practice. The other important aspect of the journey of Christian Initiation is their joining the life of the community. They learn what it means to be Catholic and to live a Catholic life today from you, all of you. Christian initiation is more like an apprenticeship than a classroom course. So, when you see one of these 'new' people, say hello and do whatever is your natural way of getting to know people. Invite them to gatherings, to coffee or whatever is on. Don't be shy about talking about your faith and what it means. You are the face of Christ to each other and to those seeking Christian Initiation. What a privilege we have been given!
